

Norfolk County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (the "Order") (NTRO10660) affecting the A140 Aylsham Bypass from its junction with Tuttington Road for 300 metres southwards (the "Road") in the Town of Aylsham to facilitate bridge joint works, the Road will be temporarily closed (except for pedestrian access) for the duration of the works/period the closure is necessary which is anticipated to be between 20:00 and 05:00 from 9<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> February 2026, but may continue to be closed/restricted until the 28<sup>th</sup> March 2026 where the closure is still required beyond the anticipated dates.

Alternative route is via: A140 Aylsham Bypass/ Cromer Road/ Norwich Road, A149 Crossdale Street/ Norwich Road/ Church Street/ Mount Street/ Loudon Road, A148 West Street/ Holt Road/ Cromer Road/ Holt Bypass/ Norwich Road/ Letheringsett Hill/ Holt Road/ Fakenham Road/ Fakenham Bypass, A1067 Clipbush Lane/ Morrisons Roundabout/ Pensthorpe Road/ Fakenham Road/ Norwich Road/ Main Road/ Sparham Hill, A1270 Broadland Northway, A140 Cromer Road/ Norwich Road/ Aylsham Bypass (Gunthorpe, High Kelling, East Beckham, Letheringsett with Glandford, Cromer, Sparham, Thornage, Upper Sheringham, Brinton, Foxley, Drayton, Weston Longville, Horsham St. Faith and Newton St. Faith, Bodham, Holt, Northrepps, Felbrigg, Beeston Regis, Roughton, Great Witchingham, Stibbard, Marsham, Ryburgh, Erpingham, Bawdeswell, Twyford, Fakenham, Morton on the Hill, Aylmerton, Guist, Little Snoring, Alby with Thwaite, Hevingham, Horsford, Runton, Stratton Strawless, Kettlestone, Aylsham, Bintree, West Beckham, Taverham, Colby, Thursford, Hainford, Hanworth, Attlebridge).

The works promoter for this restriction/closure is: Norfolk County Council.

Vehicular access will be permitted to a final destination in the Road where signs indicating such access is possible and permitted are in place.

The Order shall automatically revoke on the completion of the works when the closure is no longer necessary or otherwise on the 28<sup>th</sup> March 2026 without further notice.

If necessary, the restriction could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date the Order is effective.

A person who contravenes, or who uses or permits the use of a vehicle in contravention of the closure imposed by the Order shall be guilty of an offence.

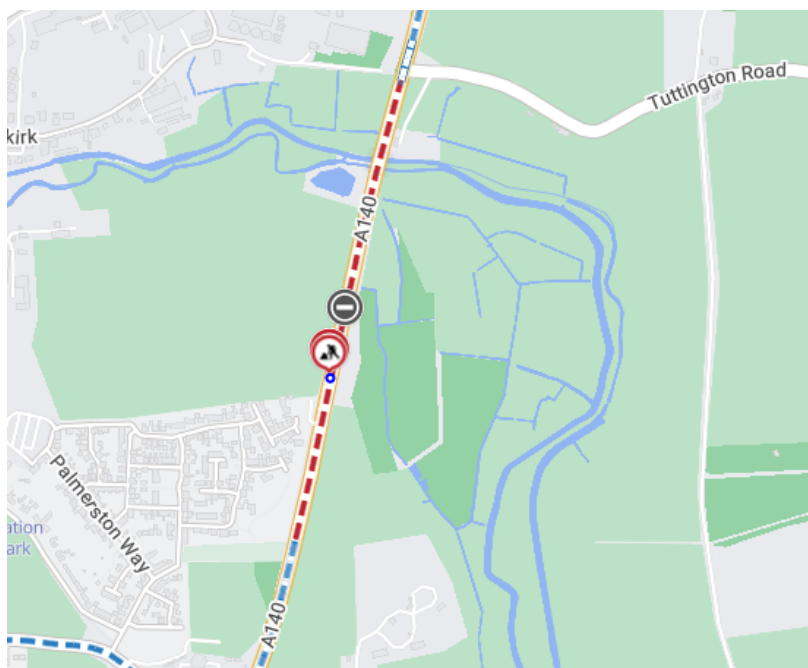
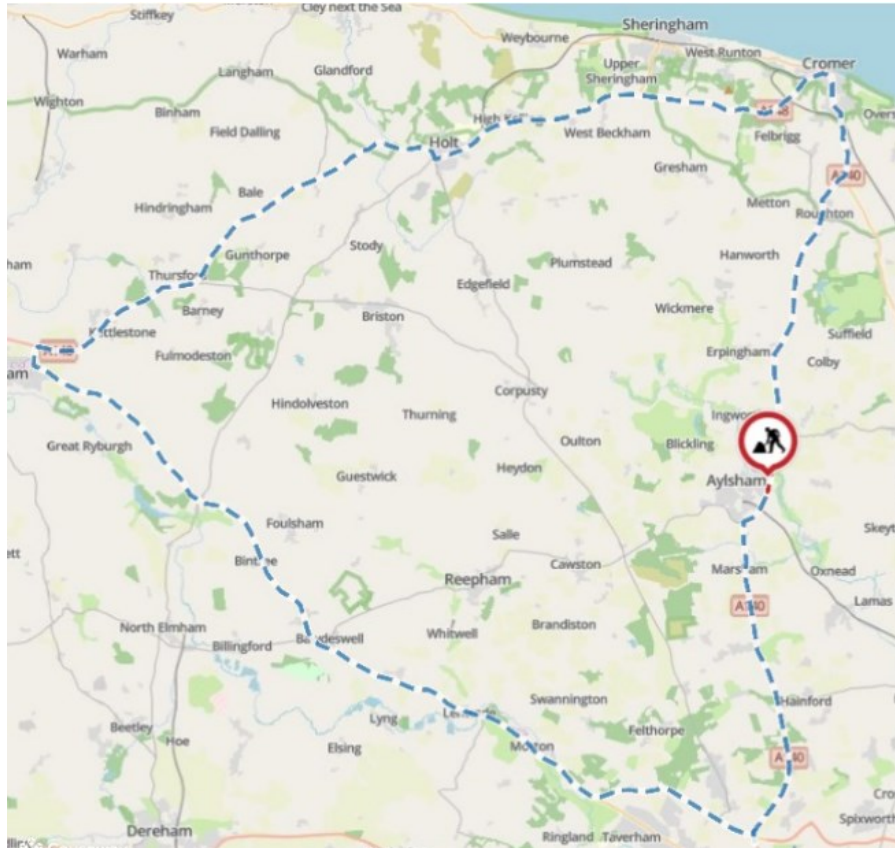
Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
